

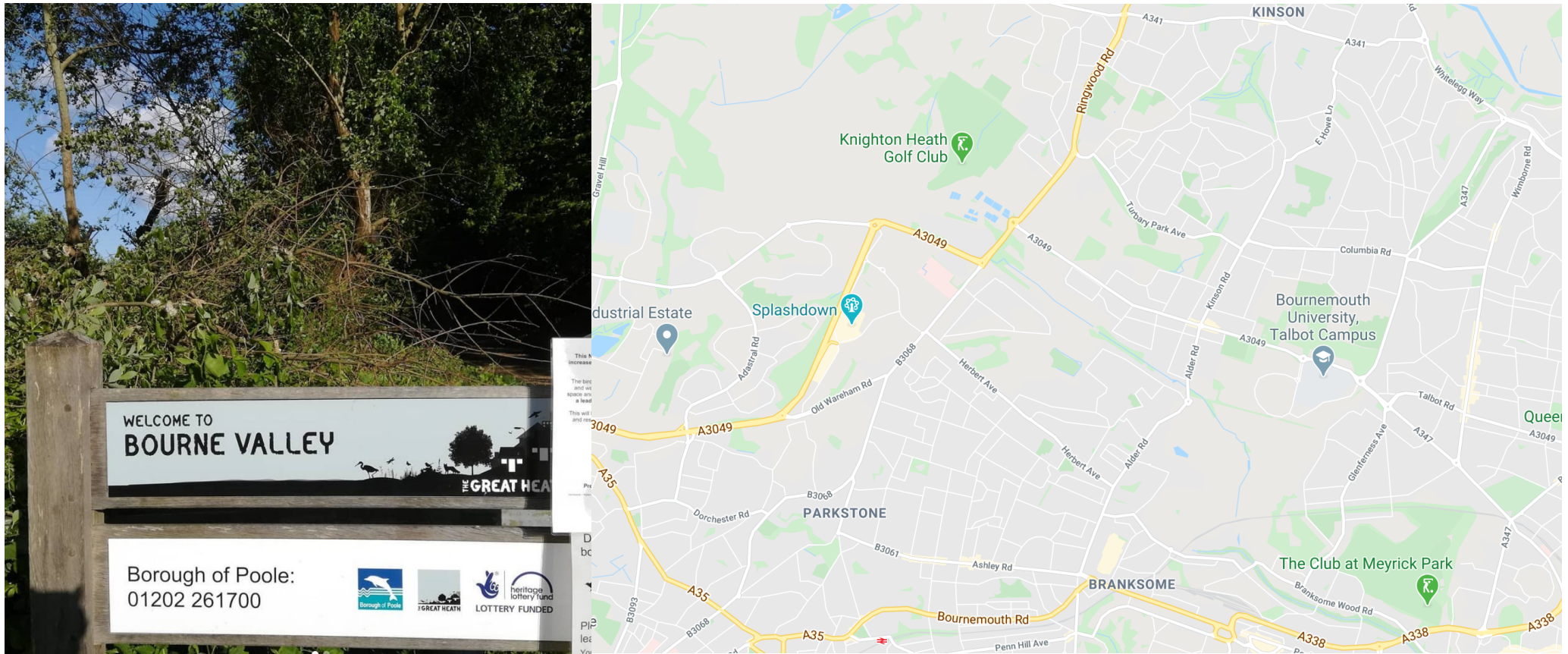
Get Creative!

FIND SOMEWHERE NEW TO EXPLORE



Using a map, find an area near you which you haven't yet explored! Go for a lovely walk, keeping your eyes peeled for all sorts of exciting things. On your walk write down anything exciting you see. Work out the correct way to go on your walk using a map.



CREATE A TREASURE MAP

This is one of my favourite activities to do! The treasure map can be completely made up OR you can design it from your garden.



- Design your map! Work out if you want to bury treasure for someone to find or design a really cool map to display somewhere.
- Time to get drawing!
- Either keep it a straight map or cut around it, giving it wavy edges.
- My favourite part!!! Tea staining. Tea staining makes the map look nice and old. To tea stain: add your tea bag to some water. Warmer water works best—remember to ask your adult for help. Leave it to soak in the water for a few minutes. Then start dabbing away. Leave to dry.



PLANT A SEED

1. Grab a pot! Anything you have around can be improvised e.g. yoghurt pots, egg shells, toilet rolls, plastic food pots or food jars.
2. Fill your pot with soil.
3. Plant a seed. There are some flowers which are seeding at the moment. Garden centres are now open! We are able to send a few out to people.
4. Put some water in! Not too much, especially if you don't have holes for the water to drain through.
5. Learn what it needs to find the best place to put it. Some plants like it sunny, but some like the shade.
6. Watch it grow!
